This month in Union History

January 27th, 1850 saw the birth of one Samuel Gompers (Gompertz) in Spitalfields, London, England. Mr. Gompers was an immigrant to America that was a Cigar maker and Founder of the American Federation of Labor (now the AFL-CIO). He was a key figure in the fight to legalize unions, create shorter working hours, and higher wages. He helped unions go from small independent locals to organized groups able to better defend the rights of the working person. As an early advocate for labor equality and freedom he was faced with prison time for his actions against unfair management practices.

"Gompers is noted for having shifted the primary goal of American unionism away from social issues and toward the "bread and butter" issues of wages, benefits, hours, and working conditions, all of which could be negotiated through collective bargaining. Gompers's AFL became the model of unionism in the United States, achieving economic goals through national trade unions that organized a network of locals and supported them."
